On behalf of the Halifax Chamber of Commerce, I wholeheartedly support the Halifax Stanfield International Airport's runway-lengthening initiative.

As the business and financial capital of Atlantic Canada, Halifax has a vibrant economy and a highly skilled workforce with experience in all aspects of the cargo shipping industry. As you know, Halifax Stanfield International Airport already lands more than 60 per cent of Atlantic commercial air cargo.
