- 7. Would you be able to defend a school board decision that you, personally, did not agree with?
- 8. Have you had training in group dynamics, board governance, conflict resolution or mediation? If not, are you willing to receive training in any or all of these areas?
- 9. Can you make decisions and seek outcomes by following a process? If so, give an example from your personal or professional life.
- 10. Would you be willing to adhere to a code of conduct for school board members, if required?
